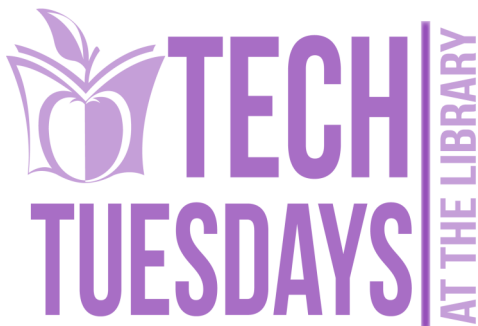


MARCIA THE MAGICAL MOOSE

SATURDAY, APRIL 12 (11:00 A.M -1:00 P.M.)

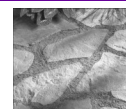
