American Girl Dolls and Star Wars Figures come with a book, carrying case and journal to record all of your adventures together!



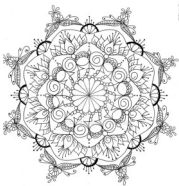

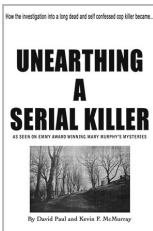

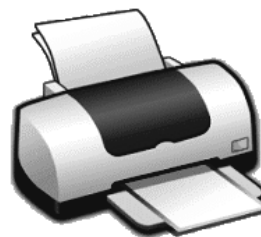

- **FREE** music service from your library. All you need is your library card and PIN number.
- Access to about 9 million songs and over 15,000 music videos.
- Stream 3 hours of live music daily.
- Download 5 free MP3's per week that you can keep. The counter resets Mondays @ 12:01am EST.
- Music videos count as "2" song credits.
- You cannot download a whole album. You will have to download one song at a time however, you can stream an album throughout your day for up to three hours.
- Mobile Apps available at the Apple App Store and Google Play. Look for "Freegal Music".
